

What is Advent?

A season of hope, preparation, EXPECTATION & celebration

Advent is made up of four weeks, divided into 2 periods:

- 1. First Sunday of Advent until December 16th. Focus: Christ's second coming at the end of time
- 2. December 17th-24th. Focus: Preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ.
- The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year.
- The Advent Wreath is a popular symbol used as the focus of prayer throughout the season.
- "Advent" (Latin) means "a coming or arrival"
- Through prayer, spiritual readings, acts of charity, and participation in Eucharist, Advent helps us to expand the meaning of our lives, so that we are not ends in ourselves, but a people who seek Christ as our hopeful end and joyful fulfilment.
- Advent is more than the preparation of Christ's birth. It also celebrates the three-fold coming of the Lord:
 - **Remembering** the events that surrounded the Lord's coming long ago
 - Celebrating his coming among us today
 - Looking forward to his final coming in glory
- Candles mark the steps in our Advent journey
- Our prayer at Advent is one of hope and love: *Come, Lord Jesus!*
