



PLEASE NOTE THE TIME CHANGE FOR PALM & EASTER SUNDAY MASSES

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The



day recalls Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of our salvation that takes place about a week before his Resurrection (Easter).

Why do we wave palms?

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds greeted him by waving palms and covering his path with small branches. We wave palms today to hail Christ in his triumph for our salvation in the light of his Paschal Mystery – his Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Holy Thursday begins with a diocesan-wide celebration called the Chrism Mass, in which all the priests of the

diocese gather with the bishop to renew their dedication to priestly service. The three different oils to be used in the sacraments during the year are also blessed and distributed by the bishop to the pastors of the parishes in the diocese.

The Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumens are blessed, while the Sacred Chrism used during baptism, confirmation, and Holy Order is consecrated by the bishop during this liturgy. Oil is an ancient symbol of strengthening, healing and preparation. Anointing is a sign of the Holy Spirit preparing us for service, one made all the more powerful by Jesus' identity as "the Christ" – or "the anointed one."
