

# THE CHRISM MASS

A COMMEMORATION OF THE INSTITUION OF THE PREISTHOOD

What happens during the Chrism Mass?

- 1. The local bishop blesses the chrism and other holy oils, and distributes them to parishes to be used over the next year.
- 2.Priest in the diocese gather in solidarity with their local bishop and renew their commitment to priestly service.
- 3. The congregation prays for those who serve the Church "Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord!" ~Psalm 89

The bishop blesses three vessels of oils:



- 1. CHRISM for baptisms and confirmations: made of oil and sweet-smelling perfumes.
- 2. SECOND OIL for catechumens: made of olive oil or some other plant oil.
- 3. THIRD OIL for anointing the sick: made of olive oil or some other plant oil.

Did you know? "Christ" means "the anointed one".

HOLY THURSDAY



After his entrance into Jerusalem, Jesus instructed his apostles to make preparations for the Passover meal. It was at that meal, the Last Supper, that Jesus gave us the Eucharist: the sacrament in which we receive his Body and Blood, and thereby are joined to his sacrifice, the New Covenant between God and his people. The liturgies of Holy Thursday bring the reality into focus, and also call us to open ourselves to not just receiving the sacrificial love of Jesus, but sharing it as well.

That evening, each parish celebrates a single evening Mass. The liturgy recalls the Institution of the Eucharist and includes a ceremony called the Mandatum. Mandatum refers to Jesus' command that his disciples "love one another as I have loved you" (Jn.13:34), powerfully symbolized by Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet. In our ritual remembrance - an essential part of papal and diocesan Holy Thursday liturgies since the Middle Ages, and incorporated into parish liturgies since 1955 – we are challenged, along with the apostles, by Jesus to imitate him fully – having been nourished by him in the Eucharist - by pouring out our lives in sacrificial love, as he was doing, through the gift of his life. The liturgies of Holy Thursday - both the Chrism Mass and the Mass in the evening - also commemorate the institution of the ordained priesthood, called to serve as Jesus did in a radical way.

Holy Thursday ends with a procession of the reserved Eucharist to an altar of repose where we will be asked, just as the apostles were, to watch and pray with Jesus on this long dark night.

# **3 DAYS THAT CHANGED THE WORLD**

The liturgies from the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday through evening of Easter Sunday are referred to as the "Triduum," meaning "three days." These are the days in which we are given the opportunity to share in the mystery and power of the Father's love as lived out in the suffering of Jesus, his Son. It is perhaps helpful to think of these days, not as separate celebrations, but as one continuous remembrance in which we meet and follow Jesus.
