

for a teaching position. It is the responsibility of the candidate to attend Sunday liturgy, be involved in parish life and contact the parish priest well in advance.

A PRAYER TO BEGIN THE SCHOOL YEAR



CATHOLIC PRAYER BODY & SOUL



For Catholic Funerals services, a rosary is often placed in the hands of the deceased. This custom says much about prayer and of how it joins us to God in life and in death. The rosary shows that prayer is a matter of the body as well as of the spirit. We are flesh and blood, and we communicate with our whole being. The rosary with its cross,

chain and beads, is something we can see and touch. The vocal prayers of the rosary involve our voices and our hearing. The words we repeat remind us that Mary and the saints are one with us. The mysteries of the rosary direct our attention to Jesus Christ and all he did to save us. Saying the rosary with others reminds us of the importance of praying with the community of believers.

The most important Catholic prayer, of, is not the rosary, but liturgical prayer, the "official prayer" of the Church. This includes the Mass, the celebration of the sacraments, and the Liturgy of the Hours.

But we have a rich tradition of other prayers stretching back over nineteen centuries. There are prayers familiar to most Catholics, like the Our Father, Hail Mary, and grace before meals. There are many kinds of prayer books, like those often given to children making their first Holy Communion or the well-worn books we have seen in the hands of parents and grandparents. There are litanies and Stations of the Cross, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, processions and blessings of every kind, dipping fingers in holy water, and the gesture that begins and ends so many occasions of prayer – the Sign of the Cross.

To see a small child reverently make the Sign of the Cross or to watch and elderly person fingering worn rosary beads with wrinkle hands, is to witness as it ought to be: the lifting up of one's whole being toward God.

From the first cross traced with chrism on our forehead at baptism to the last one traced with the oil of anointing, we raise our spirits and our hearts to God in prayer.
