

**DEVOTION TO OUR LADY** 

May as a "Marian Month" has to be understood within the context of the Easter Season. During this month, our devotion ought to highlight in a special way the sharing of the Blessed Virgin in the Paschal Mystery of Christ her Son, and in the Pentecost event that began the Church's pilgrim journey. Our devotion to Mary leads us to love God as she did; as the Mother Jesus, as the first to believe in Him, his first disciple. As Pope Paul VI reminded us, "the ultimate purpose of devotion to the Blessed Virgin is to glorify God and lead Christians to commit themselves to a life which is in absolute conformity to His will."



## **RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION**

**How long should I fast?** The general Eucharistice fast is one hour from food or beverages. Water and medicine do not break the fast. The sick and dying may receive communion any time.

**How aofter can I receive?** Persons who have already received communion may receive communion once more on the same day at any Mass in which they are participating.

What about Confession? Anyone conscious of a serious (mortal) sin must go to confession before receiving the Lord in Holy Communion.

**Who can receive?** Only Roman Catholics in good standing (practicing faithfully) may receive communion in the Catholic Church.

<u>Catholics married outside the Catholic Church may not</u> <u>receive Holy Communion</u> until they have had their marriage blessed (validated) by a priest.

Catholics are **<u>not</u>** permitted to receive communion in any other Christian church.

#### **OUR LADY OF CONSOLATION OF TURIN**



The icon of the Consolata emphasizes not so much the exterior beauty but the interior beauty of the Virgin and Child. The expression of hope is perceived behind Mary's sad face, while the adolescent-like face of Jesus stresses his eternal wisdom.

Mary's right hand is pointing to her heart as to assure us that she encloses all our needs

and afflictions, while with her slightly bent head toward Jesus, she is whispering the needs and afflictions to him.

Mary looks at us. Jesus sitting on her left arm and only grasping her thumb, seems to be there just to be given to us. With his right hand he blesses the world in the oriental manner, i.e. with two fingers stretched up expressing his two natures, human and divine, while three fingers are bent to express the Three Divine Persons of the Blessed Trinity. Mary's mantle is of a dark-blue colour with gold and red trimmings to express her Queenship in Heaven beyond the blue sky. Jesus' red robe tells us of his kingship. The three stars on Mary's mantle (one is hidden behind Jesus) tell of her triple virginity – before, during and after Jesus' birth.

Mary's ring symbolized her power and authority as spouse of the Holy Spirit.

The round halos (Jesus' halo contains the cross) express the glorious life of Heaven.

The contemplation of the icon of the Consolata can be a meditation about the mystery of the Incarnation, especially as we profess in the Creed, "*He was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man.*"
