Traditionally, the month of October is dedicated to the devotion of the Holy Rosary. In the

Archdiocese of Toronto, this same month is dedicated for the priest's seminar. This year's seminar was exceptional due to the theme and sessions selected. It was more practical and pastoral in nature. The theme was based on the question "Is your church in maintenance mode or missionary mode"? The presenters challenged and equipped us to transform the church from the maintenance to the missionary mode. One of the key features of a church in maintenance mode is its reluctance to accept change, welcome and include new members and ideas. It is important to realize that if we keep doing what we're doing; we will keep getting what we are getting! At the same time change for the sake of change will be disturbing; but change with vision will lead us to a joyful mission.

In the new year, God willing, we need to review our pastoral goals and possibilities to transform our parish into the missionary mode. Once a parish enter the missionary mode, that parish will create a space where people are comfortable bringing friends and neighbors into life and faith conversations; it can make missionary disciples of parishioners and to reach out to the fallen away Catholics, and form more and more missionary leaders.

St. Jerome's has already expressed great signs to be a missionary Church. We have 42 men and women signed up in our catechism team! We have new team leads for all ministries; a new team of sacristans have taken responsibility to oversee the nice flow of the liturgical celebrations. Our ministry harvest bore many fruits by giving enough recruits for all ministries. May I seek your continued prayers for inspiration and discernment to grow towards a missionary church.

This week our Knights of Columbus is please to present an award to two families as part of their *Family of the Month* program. **Kathleen Stokoe** was a parishioner with St. Mary's Parish and became a founding parishioner of St Jerome's to help build the church and the community. Kathleen was one of the first female Lectors, breaking the barrier when only men were Lectors. Over the past 28 years, Kathleen has served as a Lector at our 12 Noon Mass, and every Wednesday daily morning Mass at St. Jerome's. Kathleen has a longer history for 40 years as a Eucharistic Minister bringing Holy Eucharist to the sick, home bound and at retirement homes. Kathleen's dedicated service is a shining testament to her Catholic faith.

James and Christa Dye with their sons Peter, Patrick, Philip, and Paul, have been an integral part of St. Jerome's Parish since 1998. As a family, they are involved in various ministries like Baptismal Ministry, Minister of Holy Communion, Alter Servers, Refugee sponsorship program, and Knights of Columbus Squire program etc. St. Jerome's remains the Dye family's spiritual home, fostering connection and unity even as their sons have grown and moved forward.
