## Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms take place on Sundays, twice a month. Parents must participate in a preparation class before setting a date for their child's baptism. A baptismal registration form is available at the parish office on Sunday. Parents must be registered parishioners, for a minimum of six months, using offertory envelopes.

## Sacrament of Marriage

Couples planning to be married must contact one of the priests at least one year in advance. One must be a registered parishioner, using offertory envelopes. A date for the wedding will be set at the couple's first interview with the priest. A marriage course is required. For more information call the parish office.

#### RCIA

The RCIA program, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a process designed for adults who wish to become Catholic or complete their Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation). It is a 9-month program – beginning in September and culminating at the Easter Vigil – designed to teach interested candidates what Catholics believe, how Catholics practice their faith, and what it means to be Catholic.

Candidates meet weekly for lectures and journey along other candidates, mature Catholics who act as mentors, and the program teachers. Interested candidates, please contact the parish office.

## **Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

### My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



Two weeks ago, I had the privilege of attending a seminar with some of our parish leaders, reflecting on how we, as a parish community, can move from maintenance to mission. Very often, we are good at keeping the

status quo. We can be enthusiastic when forming a new parish, creative in developing ministries, and welcoming when we are small and eager to grow. However, once we pass the initial struggles and become well established, we can easily resist changes or new challenges. This tendency is what we call "maintenance mode." When a parish remains in this mode, our enthusiasm, eagerness to grow, openness to new ideas, and ability to welcome new members may begin to fade. Change is then seen as a threat rather than an opportunity, and the missionary spirit is diminished.

On Stewardship Sunday last week, Archbishop Frank Cardinal Leo reminded us: "In a world marked by division, consumption, and fear, true stewardship becomes an act of hope: a visible sign that we trust in something greater than ourselves." With this in mind, I invite each of you to prayerfully consider joining at least one ministry in our parish. We are also beginning a few new ministries to help serve one another:

Bereavement Ministry (Ministry of Consolation): This ministry seeks to provide bereaved parishioners and their families with hope and comfort in times of loss. As members of Christ's Body, we are called to care for the dying and to console those who mourn. Our goal is that no one in our parish community should grieve alone. The compassion of our loving God is shared through the presence and care of parishioners. Training will be provided for those who are interested.

**Ministry of Skill & Development:** This team will assist parishioners with practical resources—resume building, job searches, training, interview preparation, and language skills. If you have expertise in these areas and a desire to help others, please consider joining.

**St. Jerome's Guild:** This is a joyful Friday gathering of parishioners who share their time and energy to care for our church. After the 9:00 am Mass, members come together for coffee and fellowship before engaging in cheerful, voluntary work to clean and tidy our parish. It is a simple yet meaningful way of serving the community—blending prayer, friendship, and hands-on care for the house of God.

Of course, our established ministries also continue to need your time and talents. Once again, I recall Cardinal Leo's words: "As responsible stewards of God's blessings, we are loving caretakers who manage and celebrate God's gifts with reverence, gratitude, humility, and love." May we, as one family in Christ, move from maintenance to mission, and together become true stewards of God's abundant gifts.
